



Robert Port is a writer, director, and an Academy Award winner for his film "Twin Towers," a documentary about Detective Joe Vigiano, an elite New York City policeman who was killed during the tragic events of 9/11. "Twin Towers" was also screened at the prestigious Sundance Film Festival and has emerged as one of the most compelling short documentaries in recent memory.

Port's numerous network and cable drama series (Executive Producer/Writer) credits include Jack Ryan (Amazon Prime), Reef Break (ABC), ICE (Direct TV), Training Day (CBS), Agent X (TNT), Eye Candy (MTV), Ironside (NBC), NYC 22 (CBS), Numb3rs (CBS).

Previously, Port served as creative director for CBS News in its advertising and promotions department, for shows, 60 Minutes, CBS Evening News with Dan Rather, 48 Hours and Face the Nation.

He recently wrote two television dramatic pilots, one for TNT based on the book "The Hunt" by New York Times best-selling author Tim Lebbon and another for NBC/Universal on the Los Angeles County Sheriff's elite "Air Five" search and rescue unit in addition to, "Embassy, Rome" for Amazon Prime.

Port's feature debut, RECON, a WW2 thriller he wrote and directed, opened nationwide in theaters on Veteran's Day.

Port's follow-up to "Twin Towers," a feature-length documentary titled "LEGACY," has just been acquired by Lionsgate and will premiere in 2025.

He is a member of the WGA and DGA and a ten year veteran (retired) of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department.
